


Where Duxbury's recreational spaces become

## This Requires a United Effort

All stakeholders must be aligned.

- Town to give the DRC access to the Chandler Woods land.
- Town to permit utilities and allow public sponsorships.
- DRC Self-Fund (significant private and corporate funding).
- CPC funds can support but will not represent significant \$\$.
- DRC would manage field scheduling including non-conflicting field designation for Youth Sports and for High School, and third-party field rentals to allow for turf replacement every 10 years.



#### Where Are We Now?

- ✓ Significant research and site strategy with Activitas.
- Meeting with CPC to explore opportunities and limitations.
- ✓ Meeting with School Committee to begin stakeholder engagement.
- ✓ Meeting with Town officials to engage and advance critical elements of the project.
- Engage general public.
- Understand obstacles and zoning/legal implications.
- Begin meeting with private donors and companies.
- Work with Town to strategize around long-range business plan and go-forward strategy.
- Keep stakeholders informed.
